Dearborn Symphony Orchestra's Youth Artists Solo Competition

The Dearborn Symphony Orchestra's Youth Artists Solo Competition is intended to identify, recognize and encourage youth in the southeastern Michigan area who are pursuing the study of classical music and afford them an opportunity to perform with a professional orchestra.

LOCATION: Madame Cadillac Hall on the Campus of Marygrove College, 8425 West McNichols (McNichols & Wyoming), Detroit, MI 48221

The contestant will receive an e-mail stating his or her audition time no later than 7 days prior to the competition. Contestants may indicate their need for special consideration in setting the audition time **on their application.** Students may not exchange audition times with other contestants. Contestants will provide their own accompanist and both should arrive forty-five minutes before their audition time to allow for registration and warm-up. Each contestant will be allowed twenty minutes for warm-up. A limited number of warm-up rooms will be available. Not all warm-up rooms for contestants in Category I and III will be furnished with a piano. Auditions are to be accompanied. The Youth Artist's Solo Competition on Saturday is a closed audition; only judges, an accompanist and room monitors will be present for the audition.

The Equal Opportunity policy adopted by the Dearborn Orchestra Society Board also applies to this competition as required by law. Contestants who have not reached their 19th birthday by the competition date are eligible to enter.

Contestants will perform one movement of a concerto or other work composed for one or more solo instruments with orchestral accompaniment. The contestant should play at a level appropriate to the competition. Each audition will not exceed 10 minutes in length although the solo selection may be longer. The solo selection shall be one movement, memorized and the contestant should be dressed professionally. Audition tapes are not allowed. When selecting a work for performance, contestants should consider the availability and appropriateness of the music for the Dearborn Symphony.

Contestants must be residents or take regular lessons (e.g. – at least one lesson per month) from a professional music instructor who resides in one of the following Michigan counties: Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, Washtenaw or Wayne. Contestants may choose to enter in more than one category. Participants are not eligible to win the competition in the same category in two consecutive years. The concerto (in part) selected for your audition will also be the movement performed with the DOS at the Friday, May 2, 2014, concert. Contestants must provide two copies of their music to the judges, one of which should be an original copy. Auditions will be limited to the first 30 in each category, based on the application postmark date.

Categories of Competition

There are two separate categories with the top three in each category advancing to the finals:

Category I - all string instruments including violin, viola, cello, bass, and classical guitar.

Category II - piano

Category III – all wind instruments, brass and woodwinds.

Each category must have a minimum of eight applicants. If this number is not met, the category will be eliminated for this year's competition and the audition fees returned. The Dearborn Symphony also reserves to right to combine categories for the purposes of judging and eliminate the finals audition on Sunday afternoon. In this event, all contestants would be judged by music professionals with winners selected from a single audition.

Competition Awards

There will be two First Place winners among the three categories who will receive a cash prize of \$500 each, and performance with the Dearborn Symphony Orchestra at the Friday, May 2, 2014 concert. The judges reserve the right not to award a First Place winner. In such cases, a Second Place award of \$100 may be granted, but without the right to perform with the Symphony. **All decisions by the judges are final.** Winners will be informed by phone following the competition. Other contestants will receive an email notification of the results.

First Place Winner Responsibilities

Attend evening orchestra rehearsals in Dearborn from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. Tuesday evenings in late April, 2014, on the dates assigned by Conductor Kypros Markou.
